COURSE DESCRIPTION

Is your campus prepared?

This advanced two-day course is designed to train **higher education administrators, public safety officials, and community partners** in crisis management principles using a *whole community approach*.

Participants will explore **risk management strategies, effective crisis communications, and emergency operations planning** concepts as outlined in the **National Incident Management System (NIMS)**. The course integrates **case studies, facilitated discussions, and practical exercises** to help participants identify gaps in their current crisis management programs. The training culminates in a **simulated role-play exercise** designed to test response coordination and decision-making under pressure.

PARTICIPANT CRITERIA

- Participants must be **U.S. citizens**.
- A **FEMA Student Identification (SID)** is required to register.
 - Obtain or verify your FEMA SID at <https://cdp.dhs.gov/femasid>.
 - TEEX staff can assist with SID creation upon arrival.
- Prior attendance approval from the host jurisdiction may be required.
